

There are more than 60 innocence organizations in the United States.










What is the California Innocence Project?

Litigation

If strong evidence of innocence exists, we ask the court to reopen the case through an evidentiary hearing.







What is the California Innocence Project?

Exoneration!

If we can provide enough evidence of innocence to the court, the client is exonerated.







What is the California Innocence Project?

The Need for Innocence Organizations

There are almost 2,000 documented cases of wrongful convictions in the United States.







What is the California Innocence Project?

The Need for Innocence Organizations

O The leading causes of wrongful convictions are: bad identifications, false confessions, false informant testimony, official misconduct, and ineffective assistance of counsel.

What Is the California Innocence Project?

Causes of Wrongful Conviction

O Bad identifications occur due to memory problems and poor police ID procedures.

Causes of Wrongful Convictions

O False confessions often happen after long interrogations.

O Informants often falsely testify to get a benefit in their own case.


